2. UHI Transformation			

## [Paper: HEC0325-02.1] The President outlined that the UHI Transformation engagement stage was going live soon, with the full consultation in autumn. The draft statement presented would represent HISA's position, on which comments were invited by 19<sup>th</sup> March prior to its 2.1 UHI publication. Transformation Statement There was some discussion about whether tougher language might be required, for instance about it being a student-orientated process and delivering better outcomes for students beyond mere financial considerations. 3. Marketing & Communication [Paper: HEC0325-03.1] The President introduced this item in the context of changes within HISA's staffing relating to communications and the impact this might have on the social media approaches. The Shetland Depute President presented the paper, outlining the nature of BlueSky as a similar platform to Twitter, and this led to discussion of wider ethical concerns about Twitter and the forthcoming Digital Communications Coordinator post and HISA's policy on social media. There was overall agreement that HISA should explore leaving Twitter and using BlueSky. 3.1 HISA BlueSky account The following actions were noted: 1. The Director of Community and Communications would investigate which email address was used to set up UHI's Twitter account. 2. The Director of Community and Communications would note Executive support for BlueSky and would factor this into operational decisions. 3. All further views from Executive should be sent to the President. 4. AOCB 4.2 April Executive The President proposed taking this item first, noting the deadline of 24th March. It Committee was proposed moving from 1<sup>st</sup> April to 4<sup>th</sup> April due to UHI Varsity. This was agreed Meeting Dates & by Executive. **Deadlines** The Insight and Democracy Coordinator updated on plans for next week's Student Elections, building much past communication and discussion. He encouraged Executive officers to vote early so that any technical issues experienced could be solved quickly, and to protect themselves by not campaigning with HISA apparel such as lanyards or clothing and not using HISA offices if candidates to do campaign activity or store possessions. He underlined this as a chance to have fun, travel and meet lots of UHI students, and referred everyone to the elections email 4.1 2025 Student address for any problems. Elections In response to questions, he further outlined steps to be taken on candidate updated and briefings, and that turnout updates would be given at these. The President rounded up the item by wishing all candidates well, knowing from his three past elections how important it was for candidates to take care of themselves.
